In relation to:

MR PARTON: Thank you, Chair. Can I ask about ACT rangers and how many FTE rangers are employed for issues such as illegal dumping and parking, and how this compared to previous years?

Mr Iglesias: So I have to take the number of FTEs. I have to take that element on notice, and what was the second part of your question?

MR PARTON: How it compares to previous years; whether we are steady, we are increasing, we are declining.

Mr Iglesias: I would have to take that on notice as well, to compare year-on-year accurately.

CHRIS STEEL MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:—

The TCCS Licensing and Compliance unit is responsible for licensing and regulating public land and municipal services in the ACT. The Licensing and Compliance unit is made up of four teams being the Land Use Licensing, City Rangers, Investigation and the Compliance Targeting Team. These teams work as an integrated collegial unit, with all sections contributing to the overall outcomes.
