In relation to: 132 500 callouts by responding service

In Budget Statement D, Table 4 identifies that 100% of 132 500 callouts have been completed within 24 hours. It's understood that the ACT SES is the lead organisation for responding to these calls, but that the practical response in the field may be made by the ACT SES, Rural Fire Service, or Fire & Rescue as suits the circumstances. How many 132 500 calls were responded to in the field by each of the services?
