Page 50 refers to 1,373 square metres of path grinding, and 1,344 square metres of patch works undertaken to eliminate the trip hazards on community paths as an immediate measure after defects were identified.

1. How many community requests did TCCS receive regarding path grinding and patch works during 2023-2024?
2. How many of these community requests did TCCS act on and rectify the defects?

**Ms Tara Cheyne MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:**

1. Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) does not receive specific community requests for path grinding or patch works. These are treatments TCCS to remove immediate defects that are identified during inspections (both planned and reactive).
2. TCCS conducted 3,516 path inspections in response to community requests (submitted through various channels) and rectified 3,299 defects in 2023-24. Grinding and patch works are the immediate repair methods that TCCS utilises for defects that poses immediate safety risks to the community.
