2. Long term order (Third party parental responsibility) includes orders with Family Group Conference Agreement (section 390), Final CP order - Enduring Parental Responsibility (section 482) and section 280 - Enduring Parental Responsibility (EPR)

3. Short terms orders are final order that are limited to 2 years or less

4. Interim order - order adjourned with conditions to reside and Parental Responsibility (PR) is usually transferred to the Director-General in whole or part

5. Emergency Actions last for not longer than 2 working days under section 410a of the Children and Young People Act 2008
