1. How many nurses are employed by Justice Health services at the AMC?
 - a. How many of these nurses are full time?
 - b. How many of these nurses are part time or casual?
2. Are there any nurses employed by another organisation that work at the AMC?
 - a. If so, which organisations are they from?
 - i. How many of these nurses are full time?
 - ii. How many of these nurses are part time or casual?

MINISTER DAVIDSON: The answer to the Member’s question is as follows:–

1. 42
 - a. 35
 - b. 7
2. Yes
 - a. Winnunga Nimmityjah Aboriginal Health and Community Services (Winnunga), employs Nurses at the AMC.
 - i. & ii. Winnunga employs four nurses that work in the AMC from 6.30am - 8.30pm seven days a week. These nurses are permanent Winnunga employees. Nurses account for 81% of the AMC Winnunga model of care service contacts.
