In relation to: Accountability Indicators for Capital Works – amount of times budget and timeframes have been revised

**MS LEE:** Thank you. In terms of that, on that information, does the budget papers—or do you have anywhere where it tells you how many times—so if there is projects that have been rescoped or revised more than once? Is that information available?

**Mr Barr:** In the annual reports and budget papers and mid-year updates and the six monthly capital works update. So there will be four data points that occur frequently throughout the year as to the progress of projects.

**MS LEE:** Will you also take on notice the pages for those as well?

**Mr Barr:** Yes.
