Answer to Question Taken on Notice

Mr Andrew Wall MLA asked the **Minister for Corrections**, during the Standing Committee into Justice and Community Safety hearing, taken on 2 May 2014:

In relation to through care

MR WALL: I have a quick supplementary on through care. We are almost at the 12-month mark or fast approaching, what has been the average engagement for an individual in the program so far?

Ms Mitcherson: I do not think any have come off yet.

MR WALL: None of them are off?

Ms Mitcherson: I can take it on notice, but I think even a couple of the earlier ones, I was talking to Mr Naughton, who is running the program, there were a couple of early ones who I asked how were they going, and you tend to remember the early ones, because they are the ones that you talk about a lot and a couple are actually doing quite well and we are very pleased about it, but they still just need a bit of support. So there could be some that have some off, I am not sure.
