Minister's Office Feedback

Background

1. A number of administrative and legislative fees and charges fall under the responsibility of the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) as defined by the Administrative Arrangements.
2. Each year EPSDD indexes the existing fees and charges by the changes in the Wage Price Index (WPI) where it is applicable in accordance with the ACT Government's 'Fees and Charges Policy and Guidelines' (the Guidelines).
3. This brief only includes the existing fees and charges which are not to be indexed by more than WPI without explicit agreement from Cabinet.
4. This brief does not include:
 - a. Any changes or variations to existing fee payable other than the WPI which are classified as a 'major variation' without Cabinet approval; or
 - b. Any new fees and charges.
5. These fees and charges will need to go through a separate process for Cabinet's approval.
6. Changes to legislative fees and charges are determined by legislative instrument and require ministerial approval. Following your approval, the relevant instruments will be notified on the Legislation Register to commence on 1 July 2022.

Issues

7. EPSDD has reviewed its fees and charges for the 2022-23 financial year and has generally applied a WPI of 3.25 per cent across its fees and charges, unless otherwise specified by legislation.
8. The WPI rate is provided by Treasury and is consistent with the forecasted figure in the published 2022-23 Commonwealth Budget Paper.
9. The Directorate has rounded fees and charges to the nearest cent. This approach was taken to better align with the Guidelines.
10. The relevant fees and charges under your portfolio of Water, Energy and Emissions Reduction are listed as below:

13. Administratively charged fees are not levied pursuant to any statutory requirements, so they do not require any formal determination by a Minister. They are approved by me as the Director-General of EPSDD under my responsibilities.
14. The administrative fees and charges schedule are provided for your information at Attachment D.

Financial Implications

15. Revenue collected as a result of the fee increase is expected to rise. This increase will be reflected in the 2022-23 Budget Statements, as an indexation adjustment to the 2022-23 budget. No specific Revenue Initiatives had been submitted in the 2022-23 budget process that require an update to the fees and charges.

Internal

16. Relevant EPSDD areas including Environment, Heritage and Water; Statutory Planning; Development and Implementation; and Planning and Urban Policy have reviewed the proposed 2022-23 fees and confirmed the increases.
17. The proposed 2022-23 fees and charges Disallowable Instruments (DIs) and associated Explanatory Statements have been reviewed and cleared by EPSDD Legal Policy.

External

18. Access Canberra has reviewed and provided input to the Fees and Charges during the development process.

Work Health and Safety

19. The proposed changes to Fees and Charges in the attachments are not expected to impact on Work Health and Safety.

Benefits/Sensitivities

20. There is a general risk of criticism any time government increases fees and charges.

Communications, media and engagement implications

21. Little or no media attention is anticipated as all fees have been subject to 3.25 per cent indexation and are contemplated in the revenue indexation including in the 2022-23 budget.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Section 107 of the *Water Resources Act 2007* (the *Act*) permits the Minister to determine fees for the Act.

The purpose of this instrument is to determine the fees for goods and services under the Act for the 2022-23 financial year and to provide a fee exemption to facilitate meeting commitments under the Basin Plan 2012 (Cwlth).

The regulatory fees (excluding water abstraction charge) in the determination have been increased by 3.25% for the 2022-23 financial year based on the wage price index (WPI) and then appropriate rounding has been applied in relation to increases. The Government will index the Water Abstraction Charge (WAC) by 3.00% as per the decision in the 2016-17 Budget.

The instrument includes an exemption from the payment of the Grant of Water Access Entitlement (*WAE*) fee where the intended use of the water involves the Territory complying with commitments under the Basin Plan 2012 (Cwlth).

This exemption relates to the Grant of WAE fee where the entitlement would be granted (a) to provide the shared reduction amount for the southern Basin Australian Capital Territory zone and/or (b) to facilitate the Territory's participation in the Murray-Darling Basin Water Efficiency Program – ACT Led Efficiency Project.

The instrument commences on 1 July 2022.

This instrument revokes the *Water Resources (Fees) Determination 2021* (DI2021-71).

A determination under section 107 of the Act is a disallowable instrument and must be presented to the Legislative Assembly within 6 sitting days after its notification pursuant to section 64 of the *Legislation Act 2001* (**Legislation Act**).

Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS)

A RIS is not required for this fee determination due to section 36 (1) (k) of the Legislation Act, which provides that a RIS need not be prepared for an amendment of a fee consistent with announced Government policy.

The purpose of this instrument is to determine the fees for licences issued under the Act for the 2022-23 financial year.

The regulatory fees in the determination, which applied in the 2021-22 financial year, have been increased by 3.25% for the 2022-23 financial year based on the wage price index as per government's advice. Appropriate rounding has been made in relation to increases.

The determination also includes an amendment to the following fee:

- Important and exporting live fish (s 76)

The above fee description is now:

- Importing or exporting live fish or both (s 76)

The instrument commences on 1 July 2022.

This instrument revokes the *Fisheries (Fees) Determination 2021* (DI2021-70).

A determination made under section 114 of the Act is a disallowable instrument and must be presented to the Legislative Assembly within 6 sitting days after its notification pursuant to section 64 of the *Legislation Act 2001* (**Legislation Act**).

This instrument is the *Utilities (Technical Regulation) (Operating Certificate Fees) Determination 2022*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 1 July 2022.

3 Determination of fees

The fee payable in respect of each item listed in column 3 of schedule 1 and 2 is the amount for that item listed in column 4.

4 Payment of fees

- (1) A fee listed in column 4 of item 1 of schedule 1 is payable to the ACT Government by the person applying for an operating certificate described in the corresponding entry in column 3.
- (2) A fee listed in column 4 of items 2 and 3 of schedule 1 is payable to the ACT Government by the unlicensed regulated utility holding an operating certificate.
- (3) A fee listed in column 4 of items 1, 2 and 3 of schedule 2 is payable to the ACT Government by the person requesting the goods or services described in the corresponding entry in column 3.
- (4) A fee listed in column 4 of item 4 of schedule 2 is payable to the ACT Government by the unlicensed regulated utility holding an operating certificate.

5 Timing of payment of fees

The fees listed in column 4 of schedules 1 and 2 are payable on the date the matter is invoiced.

6 Waiver of fees in public interest

The Technical Regulator may waive a fee listed in schedule 1 and 2, in full or in part, if the Technical Regulator reasonably believes that it is in the public interest to waive the fee.

7 Refund or extension of time to pay fees

- (1) The Technical Regulator may refund, completely or partly, a fee payable under schedule 1 and 2, if the Technical Regulator believes it would be fair and reasonable to refund all or part of the fee.
- (2) The Technical Regulator may grant an extension of time for the payment of a fee payable under schedule 1 and 2 if the Technical Regulator believes it would be fair and reasonable to do so.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This explanatory statement relates to the *Utilities (Technical Regulation) (Operating Certificate Fees) Determination 2022*. It has been prepared in order to assist the reader of the instrument. It does not form part of the instrument.

This explanatory statement must be read in conjunction with the instrument.

Introduction

This determination is a disallowable instrument under the *Utilities (Technical Regulation) Act 2014* (the *Act*). The Act provides a technical regulatory framework for regulated utilities in the ACT. Section 110 of the Act authorises the Technical Regulator to determine fees.

Overview

The purpose of this instrument is to determine the fees payable for applying for the grant of an operating certificate to an unlicensed regulated utility and ongoing audit and compliance fees. The fees will assist in recovering the costs incurred by the Technical Regulator in meeting the Regulator's obligations under the Act.

This disallowable instrument determines fees payable by an unlicensed regulated utility when applying for the grant of an operating certificate and for regulatory activities related to audit and compliance of an operating certificate and the development or amendment of relevant technical codes.

This instrument revokes the *Utilities (Technical Regulation) Operating Certificate Fees Determination 2019* (DI2019-204).

Outlines of the fees

Schedule 1 of the instrument applies to an unlicensed regulated utility requiring an operating certificate other than solar installations that are 200 kilowatts (*kW*) to 1 megawatt (*MW*). The fees in item 1 and 3 are based on the hourly cost for granting a certificate and for administration and regulation of the operating certificate. Item 2 is an annual fee for the review of annual reports submitted in compliance with

conditions of operating certificates. This fee structure is intended to represent full cost recovery for the ACT Government for each unlicensed regulated utility that provides a regulated utility service and that is assessed and regulated. The annual increase of 3.25% is imposed to fee for 2022-23 and 2023-24 years which is the standard increase of Wage Price Index (WPI) for those years. For 2024-25, the rate of increase is based on WPI of 3.50%.

Schedule 2 applies to all solar installations 200kW-1MW (200kW and above but less than 1MW) to reflect costs for granting a certificate, cost for inspections by licensed electrical inspectors, and cost for administration and regulation of the operating certificate. To issue operating certificates, all solar installations below 1MW require inspections by licensed electrical inspectors. Solar installations of 1MW and above require engagement with independent certifiers for the inspections and payment of the fees shown in schedule 1. The annual increase of 3.25% is imposed to fee for 2022-23 and 2023-24 years which is the standard increase of Wage Price Index (WPI) for those years. For 2024-25, the rate of increase is based on WPI of 3.50%.

The type of operating certificate that may be required depends on the kind and size of the regulated utility service being provided. These could include a Design and Construct Operating Certificate for larger installations issued prior to the construction of infrastructure or a Provision of Service Operating Certificate issued when the unlicensed regulated utility is ready to commence providing the service. A Compliance Operating Certificate may be issued to smaller installations designed, built and inspected in compliance with the *Electrical Safety Act 1971*, the *Water and Sewerage Act 2000* or the *Gas Safety Act 2000*.

The determination also includes an amendment to the following fee:

- Cost recovery fee for audit, review of reports or compliance activity in accordance with conditions of the operating certificate

The above fee description is now:

- Regulatory activities in relation to audit and compliance of an operating certificate and development or amendment of technical codes – per hour

Regulatory impact statement (RIS)

A RIS is not required for this fee determination due to section 36 (1) (k) of the *Legislation Act 2001*, which provides that a RIS need not be prepared for an amendment of a fee consistent with announced government policy.

Human rights

No human rights are impacted by this instrument.

Administratively Set Fees and Charges

Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate

1. Services provided by the **Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD)** are specified in column 1 of the schedule and the fee for that service in the 2022-23 financial year is specified in the corresponding entry in column 3 of the schedule. Where applicable, GST inclusive fees are marked with a double asterisk (**).
2. The fees in column 3 are payable to the ACT Government by a person requesting the goods or services listed in column 1 of the schedule.
3. The previous year's fees are shown in column 2 for information only. The administrative fees for 2022-23 have been increased by 3.00%, in line with the ACT Treasury's wage price index factor, as announced in the Fees and Charges Policy and Guidelines and rounded where applicable for collection purposes.
4. The fees listed in the schedule are for services provided by EPSDD that are not required by legislation. The fees are levied on a fee for service and cost-recovery basis. As they are not statutory fees, they do not require formal determination by the Minister.
5. The fees have been developed in consultation across EPSDD and with Access Canberra.
