In relation to: outcome of the reasonable adjustments tool pilot

MR MILLIGAN: Yes, okay. And what was the most common reasonable adjustment needed for young people? What is that?

MS RULE: I think we would have to take that on notice, Mr Milligan. We do not have the detail of the outcome of those assessments with us.

MINISTER DAVIDSON: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:–

The most commonly identified reasonable adjustments needs from the Tool for Reasonable Adjustment (TIRA) Pilot were related to:

- difficulties concentrating for 10 minutes;
- difficulties remembering information;
- difficulties understanding others; and
- difficulty with reading.

The reasonable adjustments required for each individual were tailored to their level of need, overall functioning and other individual factors.
