Asked by Ms Elizabeth Lee:

In relation to: Breakdown of residential and business split - Next Gen Energy Storage

MR MILLIGAN: You mentioned 1,300 uptake, is that just residential? Or is that residential and business?

Mr Temby: Yes, that is a combination of residential and business. But most of the assistance to date have been residential.

MS LEE: Have you got the split?

Mr Temby: We could that, it would not be hard to—

MS LEE: Thank you.

MINISTER RATTENBURY: The answer to the Member's question is as follows:—

The 1,300 systems/6.3 megawatts of storage supported under the Next Generation Energy Storage program to date have primarily been residential. However, there has also been a smaller number of installations (22, or around 140 kW of storage) for community organisations and construction firms undertaking new builds (that may be residential or commercial).
