Mr Finlay: Well, the PDFs have improved, but the PDFs have a cap because the PDFs—there is a limit to how machine-readable they can be because they are a proprietary format.

Mr Finlay: Well, I believe we have gone as far as we can on the PDFs, but I will take that on notice and just check whether there is further work that could be done to improve the PDFs.

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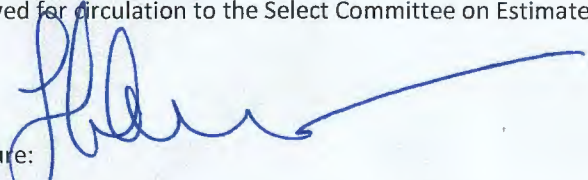
