## **ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE**

Ms Castley: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services

Ref: Roads and Bridges - TCCS

In relation to: Jabanunga Avenue

- 1) Has the construction tender for Jabanunga Crescent and Tarra Place been published?
  - a. If not, why not?
  - b. If yes, when was it published?
- 2) Has construction started on Jabanunga Avenue and Tarra Place?
  - a. If yes, when did construction start?
  - b. When will construction be completed?
  - c. What is the cost for construction?
  - d. Which company is undertaking the work?
  - e. If no, when will construction start?
  - f. Why has construction not started yet?
- 3) Has there been any consultation with residents about construction dates and impacts on their property?
  - a. How often does the government consult with residents?
- 4) Will the government be reimbursing individuals if damage has occurred to their house or does occur to their house from ground water?

## Chris Steel MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: -

- 1) Yes.
  - a. N/A.
  - b. The construction tender was advertised on 2 July 2022 and closed on the 28 July 2022.
- 2) Construction has not started yet.
  - a. N/A.
  - b. Works are expected to commence after contract award (mid- September and completed by late January 2023, weather permitting).
  - c. The total budget for constructions works is \$2.1 million.
  - d. This will be published following contract award.
  - e. Refer response (b).
  - f. The design has taken longer than anticipated.
- 3) Residents have been consulted regarding the construction timeframes and impacts to their property.

- a. Letters have been provided to residents informing them of the status and progress of the work, and parking/access arrangements to and from their property during construction. In addition, officers from TCCS have conducted a number of doorknocks on houses impacted by the works.
- 4) Reimbursement to residents will be considered if:
  - i. The residents have provided access to their property to undertake a Dilapidation Investigation; and
  - ii. It can be demonstrated that there is a clear link between any damage caused to their property being a result of these works.
