It continues to be a concern for RSPCA ACT that year on year we seek additional funding for management of cats in the ACT yet no further funding is allocated. RSPCA ACT is the sole point of call for all stray, lost and feral cats in the ACT. We have worked tremendously hard in this area and the

government still only funds a small portion of the costs of this service delivery. This funding gap feeds into our overall funding gap, which while being recognised by the government seems to not

attract the level of funding required. Government remains adamant in only providing RSPCA with a contribution for our services, when we have undertaken detailed analysis over the last three years which demonstrates a clear shortfall in funding. As a charity we are increasingly concerned that government simply allows RSPCA to make up the shortfall from capital reserves, which at some point will erode below dangerous levels, which could ultimately put our entire service at risk. For the sake of a small increase in our funding base the government is essentially taking a higher risk approach to animal welfare services in the long run. Our third priority area is wildlife management and ensuring that a balanced approach remains in place across the territory as more green field sites are developed for housing. As pressure for land increases the role of RSPCA providing care for injured and displaced wildlife will also increase and government needs to be aware of that issue.
