In relation to: Wellbeing Framework

Acknowledging that trust in government and trust in other institutions are two indicators of wellbeing in the ACT Wellbeing Framework, how will you ensure that these indicators are being implemented? What data will you use to measure the indicator? Who is responsible?

**MINISTER STEEL:** The answer to the Member's question is as follows:—

The Wellbeing Framework identifies 12 domains, including Governance and Institutions. This domain supports all Canberrans, so the Government can hear their opinion, and they can connect with and be part of key government processes. It recognises that all Canberrans will have a government and other institutions that respect human rights, are responsible, reliable, have integrity, are open and are fair.

Measuring performance against this domain involves the indentation of indicators and the reporting against these indicators, using available data and survey information collected over time. This work is currently underway.

The Wellbeing Framework is a whole of government approach and all Directorates have a role in the delivery of the framework and reporting on its success.
