Regarding the request for submissions to the Enquiry into Road Transport I would like to request that consideration be given into making it mandatory for Road Workers to remove signage when not actually working on the road eg outside of working hours etc. For instance it is ridiculous to force people to drive at 40 KPH when there is not actually any work being carried out at that time.
