ANSWER TO QUESTION ON NOTICE

Mark Parton MLA: To ask the Minister for Transport and City Services

Ref: Portfolio area, Transport Canberra and City Services

Hearing Date: 18/07/2023

In relation to: TCCS Management of Raw Materials

- 1) What raw materials are stored at TCCS depots? Sand? Stone? Wood? Bark?
- 2) How many TCCS depots would be staffed or operational on weekends?
- 3) How are depots secured when not staffed or operational?
- 4) How many incidences have there been of theft of raw material at TCCS depots since 2015?
- 5) How many staff have been terminated or received formal performance management since 2015 in relation to the theft of raw materials at TCCS depots?
- 6) Are there CCTV cameras at all TCCS depots and are these reviewed and monitored for weekend activity?

Chris Steel MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: –

- 1) A range of raw materials are stored in selected TCCS depots, including sand; pavers; cold mix; line-marking materials; millings; mulch and granite.
- 2) TCCS Depots are not staffed during weekends, however, they remain accessible to staff who are required to work on weekends.
- 3) TCCS Depots are secured via a variety of means including; camera surveillance, boundary fencing, boom gates and security card access and alarm systems.
- 4) Raw materials are rarely targeted in incidents of theft. TCCS does not have an easily accessible database of these specific incidents since 2015.
- 5) Three TCCS staff members have been the subject of allegations of theft of raw materials since 2015 where an investigation has been finalised.

- 6) The majority of TCCS depots have CCTV cameras in operation. CCTV footage is reviewed following a reported incident or concern.
