QUESTION ON NOTICE

ELIZABETH KIKKERT MLA: To ask the Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs

Ref: Budget Statement G, p.26: output class 1.3 (Community Services Directorate)

In relation to: Healing and Reconciliation fund

- 1. It was stated in hearings that recruitment of staff for the governance of the fund was delayed but is now in process. Can the minister please provide the following information:
 - a. How many FTE staff will be employed in relation to the fund?
 - b. What will be their various responsibilities?
 - c. When is the recruitment process expected to be complete, and when will staff commence employment?
 - d. What are the conditions of employment? For example, does one need to have a traditional connection to the ACT?

MINISTER STEPHEN-SMITH MLA: The answer to the Member's question is as follows: —

- 1. a) 2.0 FTE across two years a Senior Officer Grade C (SOGC) and an Administrative Service Officer Grade 6 (ASO6).
 - b) The responsibility of the FTE is to establish a governance framework and implement local initiatives including policy and program work.
 - c) The SOGC has been engaged and a recruitment is underway to fill the ASO6.
 - d) The positions are designated positions in accordance with section 42, Discrimination Act 1991 and only open to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people. Applicants do not need to have a traditional connection to the ACT.
